There was hope in resurrecting our organ for worship services, but the electronics are, unfortunately, unreliable. Fortunately, technology has advanced so that software companies are now able to capture the sound of real classic pipe organs.

Such a company, Hauptwerk, creates exact sonic replicas of iconic pipe organs from around the world. Our "new" Hauptwerk organ is a virtual version of a fantastic pipe organ currently at St. Anne's, an old church in Birmingham, England. The organ was built in 1907 and is famous for its beautiful sound.

Daniel will now lead our singing and playing on this incredible organ, running the software on a Mac laptop connected to a single MIDI keyboard.
